Dear Sirs and Madams:

As religious leaders representing a diversity of denominations across the State of Washington, we are writing to oppose coal export from Washington ports and to ask you to include the widest possible consideration of impacts in the scoping process for the proposed Cherry Point coal export terminal.

Although we come from different faith traditions, we all hold sacred the belief that God created the world and it is good. We ask that as part of this scoping process that you consider the impact the health of our children, the vibrancy of Washington's non-coal economy, and the future of God's creation here and across the Pacific.

Religious communities know that we must transition away from the mining, burning, and exporting of coal since breaks the covenant with our Creator. Coal is a public health threat through all stages of its production and use because it poisons our air and water. As pastoral leaders, we can not stand by quietly as the health of people and God's creation is compromised.

Shipping Montana and Wyoming strip-mined coal through Northwest ports encourages the building of new coal plants across Asia that would lock in decades of toxic pollution and carbon emissions. This smog from the Far East would blow right back across the Pacific to Washington to acidify our ocean, poison our fish, and contribute further to warming our planet.

Closer to home, exporting coal from our state would impose huge risks and costs on our communities. Mile and a half-long trains would block our streets and large amounts of toxic coal dust would accumulate along rail routes and at coal ports. It is a bad choice for the health and well-being of the towns involved, and a terrible legacy for future generations. We need to say no.

There are also good economic reasons to oppose coal export from Washington's deep water ports. Better jobs can be created from the taxpayer dollars that would be needed to build rail overpasses and other infrastructure for the coal trains. Continued investment in renewable energy will create more jobs, more wealth, and the healthy and productive future we want for our families. Committing our shorelines, rail lines, and port communities to coal export is a dead end economic strategy, which will foreclose more robust and sustainable economic development. We can and must do better.

Shipping coal through Washington communities to be burned in Asia goes against values of care for creation, stewardship, and justice. We cannot sell our greatest assets, harm our poorest brothers and sisters, and imperil the future of our children for the benefit of a few huge coal companies. The moral and spiritual cost of coal export is too high.

Please include these specific impacts as part of the scoping process:

- The combined effect of five proposed coal export terminals – ie, ensure that the scope be area-wide, to consider all five proposals together rather than review each separately.
- The effects on human health from coal dust, coal burning, coal particles in water supplies.
- The amount of coal dust that will escape from train cars along the rail lines from Montana/Wyoming to Cherry Point, and the impact of that coal dust on human health, air and water quality, and train derailments.
- The effects of increased train traffic and mile-long coal trains in along the entire rail route, including small towns cut in half, the impact on existing local businesses and future economic development, and the impact of delaying emergency responders.
- Heavy trains derail in hot weather, especially when tracks are covered with gritty coal dust. Seven trains derailed last summer. How can we prepare for predictable, large-scale accidents?
- The effects of coal dust on local agriculture, including vintners, dairies, and livestock.
- The impact on local fisheries – how will a coal port affect herring, salmon, traditional Lummi fishing and crabbing grounds as well as the livelihoods of commercial fishermen?
- The impacts can we expect from sound and diesel pollution in the many cities and towns along the route.
- The impact on air quality in Washington from Cherry Point coal being burned in Asia.
- The impact of ocean acidification from Cherry Point coal burned in China and the effects on Washington shellfish growers and sea life.
- The impact of many more ocean-going vessels in the Strait of Juan de Fuca. What kinds of accidents, dumping and pollution can we expect? How with they be mitigated?

Thank you for your intensive gathering of comments on this important issue. We are grateful for the opportunity to request that the above issues be included in the scoping process. We strongly oppose the construction of a coal export terminal at Cherry Point and are confident that a thorough review of the impacts will lead the co-lead agencies to the same conclusion.

TRAINS ON HOLD AFTER MUDSLIDES

Fifteen mudslides hit BNSF Railway tracks between Seattle and Everett during recent heavy rain.

Spokesman Gus Melonas says the largest occurred early Tuesday at Everett and covered 50 feet of track up to 15 feet deep with mud, rocks and trees.

Passenger trains, both Amtrak and the Northline Sounder, are on hold Wednesday as a safety precaution. For Sounder users, backup bus service for Edmonds, Mukilteo and Everett can be found on Sound Transit's website: seati.ms/SQa6xr.

Amtrak will provide alternative transportation. Passengers with questions can call 1-800-USA-RAIL.

Sounder trains won't run Thursday in observance of Thanksgiving.

The Sounder will operate on a special holiday schedule Friday (seati.ms/UhEHGO) — if there are no new mudslides.

Mudslides cancel Sound Transit run

Sound Transit announced it will cancel special day-after-Thanksgiving train service through Everett, Mukilteo, Edmonds and Seattle, because mudslides continued to occur Wednesday on the bluffs along Puget Sound.

By policy of BNSF Railway, which owns the tracks, all passenger travel is suspended for 48 hours after a mudslide.

Spokeswoman Kimberly Reason said service is expected to resume Monday morning, but riders should check for Sound Transit alerts, in case there are more mudslides.

Southline service will still proceed Friday, on a special schedule: seati.ms/UhEHGO.


NO COAL EXPORT!

Dear Army Corps of Engineers, Washington Department of Ecology, and Whatcom County Planning and Development Services:

As a person of faith, I strongly oppose the construction of a coal export terminal at Cherry Point, WA and transporting coal on trains and ships throughout the Northwest. This proposal would negatively impact my community by increasing congestion and noise with more coal train traffic, polluting our air and waterways, harming existing businesses, and delaying emergency responders. It would also damage aquatic ecosystems and fishing grounds at the terminal site, increase tanker traffic and the potential for shipping accidents and spills, expand strip-mining in Montana and Wyoming, and escalate climate change. I urge you to consider these impacts in the scope of the Environmental Impact Statement.
